






Children's Survivor Benefits (CSRS/FERS)

Highlights

- » An unmarried, dependent child (under age 18, or 22 if a full-time student) will receive a monthly benefit if their federal parent dies
 - CSRS/FERS & Working/Retired
- » NOTE: This is VERY different from Spousal Survivor Benefits












- » Most federal workers pay 6.2% of their pay into SS and can receive benefits at age 62
- » The SS payment changes each year based on CPI-W
- » If a recipient has a job earning "too much" money, this benefit can be reduced or eliminated (called the "earnings test")














Highlights

» No changes have been made to the FEGLI program for 2025












Federal Long-Term Care Insurance Program

Highlights

- » Since December 2022, the FLTCIP has been suspended by OPM
- » During this suspension, new applications will not be accepted
- » The FLTCIP is suspended until at least December 2026
